Guest Speakers

Theresa McGuiness-Acting Superintendent/Assistant Superintendent

Talked about her experiences in teaching/administrative and guidance counseling for many years around the New Hampshire area. Also spoke about what the interim role is for the new superintendent. Has a committee to make school report cards more standard base.

Elizabeth Kaplan- Math and Science Elementary Curriculum Coordinator

Elizabeth Kaplan also came to speak about Destination Imagination and Math and Science nights here at the school. She talked about having a Math/Science night at all schools and looking into grant funding for the Cunniff and Lowell.

Destination Imagination is about kids designing and competing. Talked about having 1 new DI team here in Watertown to practice and compete. This year's book fair schedule will be similar to last years. We will be hosting a public sale in the Lowell gym on Sunday, Dec. 4th. Set up will be on Saturday, Dec. 3rd. The remainder of the week will be a Lowell only sale, hosted in the library. This event requires a lot of volunteers for short amounts of time. Given this fundraiser has a direct impact on the quality of the Lowell library we would love a lot of volunteers.

Literacy Night:

Literacy Night will be on Friday, December 9th. This is the last night of the book fair. There is a team of Lowell teachers that are working out the details for this event. The PTO will communicate the event and pay for it, but the majority of this will be run by the teaching team.
